

Questions & Answers

Am I eligible for curbside service?

You must reside in a residential dwelling or an apartment with no more than four units, have garbage can service, and be within the city limits.

How do I get curbside recycling service?

Just call Moscow Recycling at **882-0590** and we will have bins and info delivered to your residence.

What day do I set out my curbside bin?

Your curbside bin should be set out for collection by 7:00 a.m. on Friday (or the night before).

Where do I place my curbside bin?

Set your bins near, but separate from, the location used for garbage collection.

What if I place non-recyclables in my bin?

The recycling collector will leave these items.

Why are some items not accepted?

Our curbside recycling truck has a limited number of compartments so we are unable to take every item that we accept at Moscow Recycling. Please bring these items to our 24-hour drop-off area at 401 N. Jackson Ave. Check out our web page MoscowRecycling.com for a list of recyclables.

What's an "Oops!" Tag?

Oops! Tags are a neon green sticker that will help you identify why items may have been left behind.

What if my recyclables get wet?

Don't worry, if your recyclables get wet, it's OK.



Please note that curbside recycling bins are the property of Moscow Recycling. Bins are to remain with the property, not the occupant, in the event of a move.

Missed Collections?

To ensure uninterrupted service, please follow the instructions outlined in this brochure.

Most missed collections can be avoided by having your sorted recyclables set out by 7:00 a.m. on Friday.

If you put your recyclables out *before 7:00 a.m.*, and they were not collected, please call Moscow Recycling **882-0590** as soon as possible.



Sorting Instructions

1. Separate into paper grocery bags as shown in the example. Please do not use plastic bags as they are not recyclable at Moscow Recycling and stick to recyclables when dry (static) or wet.
2. If you have more materials than will fit in one bag, you can place more than one bag of this material out for collection.
3. You may also place materials in extra containers or boxes that you possess.
4. The example to the right is just one possible way to sort your recyclables. What's most important is that the materials in the bags are sorted properly.

Recyclables Accepted

Aluminum Cans: Please rinse. Flat OK. No foil.

Glass Bottles & Jars: All colors of glass. Discard lids. Rinse glass. Paper labels OK. No windows, windshields, drinking glasses, vases, light bulbs, mirrors, ceramics or pyrex.

Mixed Waste Paper: Includes junk mail, file folders, index cards, brochures, envelopes, computer and white ledger paper, single-ply paperboard (e.g. cereal & shoe boxes), pulpboard (e.g. egg cartons), construction, wrapping and tissue paper, paper towel cores, catalogs. **NO:** Napkins, paper towels or plates, facial tissues, photos, hard/soft bound books, or aseptic (e.g. no foil-lined or plastic-coated cartons such as milk, soy, juice, soup, ice cream).

Magazines: Place in paper sack with newspapers

Newspaper: Place in paper sack and set next to bin. Please do not tie up newspaper.

Phone Books: Place with newspaper.

Cardboard: Please flatten. Please bring large loads to Moscow Recycling (flattened stacks taller than your knee).

Tin/Steel Cans: Please rinse. Paper labels OK. Can leave lid attached.



PETE

Plastic: See-through, screw top plastic bottles and jars. They can have color (like green Mountain Dew) as long as you can see through it. No clamshells or non-clear #1 plastic. Rinse containers and discard lids.



HDPE

Plastic: Cloudy milk jugs and similar containers. No solid colored plastic. Rinse and crush containers. Discard lids.
