Spring Clean-Up

Excludes Commercial and City of Moscow Residents

Only in April Bulky Waste Sites **WILL ACCEPT** household waste. It's time to dispose of unwanted items for free. Household waste includes all plastic material items like furniture, flower pots, coolers, toys, feed bags, insulation, vacuum cleaners, other small appliances or rubber materials like garden hoses. Sites **DO NOT** accept E-waste (monitors/TV's), hazardous or asbestos waste. Questions? 208.883.5706 or 208.882.5724. **There is a limit of 2-trips per household. Extremely large loads must use the Transfer Station schedule.** Year round the program accepts a limit of 2-large appliances, 4-passenger vehicle tires (no rims), scrap metal and inert demolition waste including yard waste, furniture (no plastic), mattresses, carpet, roofing, brick tile, concrete, drywall and untreated lumber.

Did You Know Burning Trash Is Illegal?

Although burning trash is illegal, you may burn small amounts of residential yard debris from your property with local approval, if required. Burning of yard waste is not allowed May 10th through October 20th, unless you have a permit from Idaho Department of Lands. All other materials should be recycled or properly disposed of at the Solid Waste Processing Facility at 3299 Hwy 8, Moscow.

Remember all residents of Latah County have free disposal of yard waste. Latah County and the City of Moscow work hard to educate the public on recycling and disposal services. Our goal is to prevent theft of services, illegal burning and dumping of waste. Contact your local government with questions. Plan ahead for proper disposal.

Woodstove Accessories – Act Now!

The Idaho Department of Environmental Quality dropped off a few boxes of Carbon Monoxide Alarms, Moisture Meters, and Woodstove Thermometers FREE for Latah residents. The freebies are available first come, first serve. Pick them up at the Latah County Courthouse Solid Waste Office, while supplies last.

Don't miss out on tax deductions!

Did you know the state of Idaho offers a tax deduction for replacing your old woodstove? Residents can deduct 40% of the total purchase price (including installation) on their 39R Idaho tax form for the tax year the woodstove (or insert) is replaced. In order to qualify, the old stove must be a non-EPA-certified unit manufactured before 1992; the replacement must be an EPA-certified unit installed in your residence; and you must get a receipt for your old unit's disposal at Latah Sanitation within 30 days of your new stove's purchase. KIDS CORNER | Bury an Egg and See What Happens...



Egg shells have lots of minerals that help plants grow, like calcium, nitrogen and phosphoric acid. Adding an egg to your soil will make your plants very happy.

- Break an eggshell near the top and pour out the egg.
- Make scrambled eggs with an adult.
- Put dirt and seedlings in the big egg shell (no need to rinse it out).
- Add water and put the egg back in the egg carton.
- When the seedlings sprout, bury the egg shell in the soil so the tops of the seedlings poke out.
- The egg shell will decompose, feeding your seedling's soil!
